## President Obama Comes to the Everglades



In April, we were privileged to have President Obama come to southeast Florida on Earth Day. In his speech from Everglades National Park, he acknowledged local leaders who formed the bipartisan Southeast Florida Regional Climate Change Compact and praised the Compact as "a model not just for the country, but for the world."

## Compact Announced as Climate Action Champion



The White House has recognized the Compact as a

Climate Action Champion following a nationwide competition. Only sixteen cities, regions, and tribal governments across the county were selected as the first group of Climate Action Champions. The four-County Compact joins Seattle, San Francisco, Portland (OR), Boston, Minneapolis, the DC metro area, and other climate-leader communities.

The designation honors the “decisive action to cut carbon pollution and build resilience” already undertaken by the four Compact counties. [Read more.](#)

## West Palm Beach Signs Mayors' Pledge

## RCAP Implementation Workshop on Transportation

The **RCAP Implementation Workshop on Transportation** was held on April 30 at the Broward MPO offices in Ft. Lauderdale. Attended by 60 local transportation professionals from the MPOs, FDOT, the four counties and municipalities in the region, topics ranged from modeling for the impacts of climate change on transportation assets to EV charging stations and bike sharing.
